- Entrance fee: IDR 100,000 adults, IDR 50,000 children
- Wheelchair accessible: Yes
- Visit nearby: Nusa Dua Beach, a beautiful white sand beach perfect for relaxation.

2. Neka Art Museum

Perfect for: Art lovers and those interested in Balinese paintings and sculptures.

- Hours: Mon-Sat 9am-5pm, Sun 12pm-5pm
- Entrance fee: IDR 100,000 adults, IDR 50,000 children

3. Museum Puri Lukisan

4. Don Antonio Blanco Renaissance Museum

5. Setia Darma House of Masks and Puppets

8. Museum Rudana

9. The Ogoh Ogoh Bali Museum

10. Batur Geopark Museum
